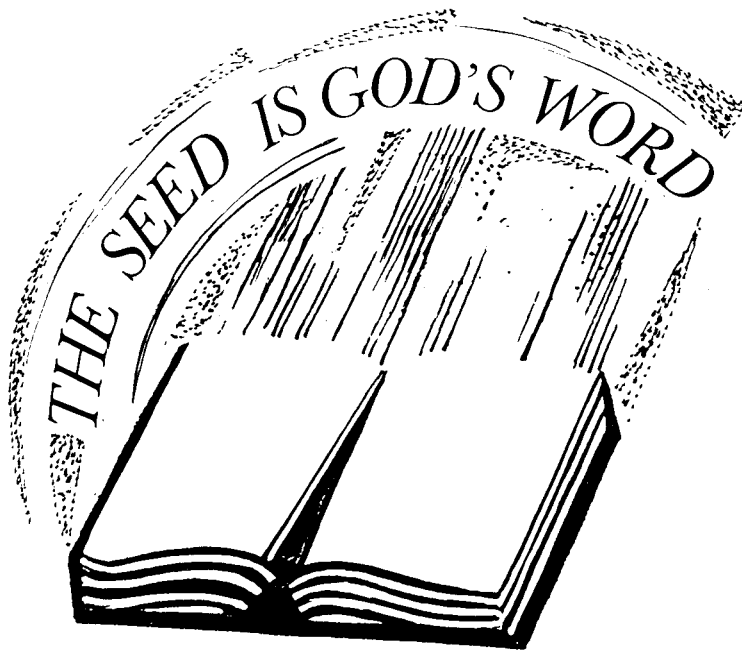


HOLY COMMUNION
