And for the very young and the young at heart...

Children under three are encouraged to stay with their parents throughout the service in the Family Area, where there is a supply of books, soft toys and materials for drawing.

One Saturday afternoon each month people of all ages gather in the Church Hall for "Messy Church". From 4.00—5.00 p.m. the hall is given over to craft activities and messy play. At 5.00 p.m. there is a story and a prayer, followed by a meal together.
